Storage Features – What Should Be Inside My Cabinets?

Didn't a parent or teacher tell you at least once if not a thousand times "It's what's on the inside that counts"? That rings true in cabinetry design as well. Most designers would argue that the outside aesthetic and the interior features are equally important because not only do you want to love the look of your space but it also has to support your daily workflow. Storage features are a big part of that.

And let's not pigeon hole this conversation to be just for kitchens – many of these storage features work well in the bathroom, laundry, home office and mud room...wherever storage is needed.

Generally, storage options are broken down into the type of cabinet into which it is typically installed – Wall, Base or Corners (wall or base). Tall cabinets tend to have Base features installed in the lower portion and Wall features in the upper. So let's take a look at different options and where they can most often be found.

Keep in mind that even if a cabinet company doesn't offer a storage item as standard in their catalog, many of these items can be added to your cabinets by your installation team.
